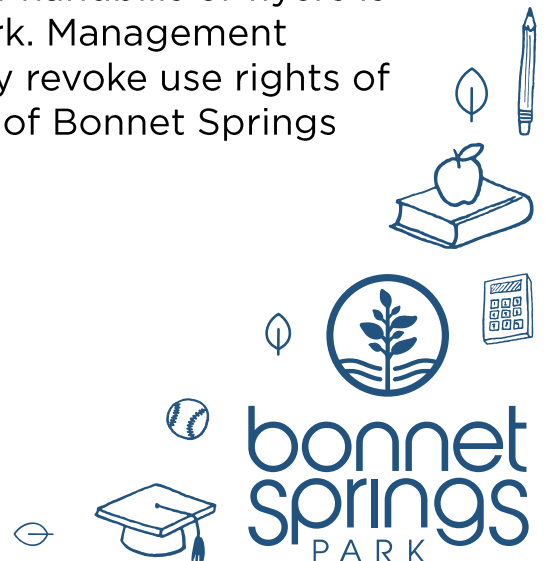




BSP Code of Conduct

Bonnet Springs Park is a “Play at your own risk” park. Bonnet Springs Park is not responsible for injuries that occur on the park’s property. Parents/Guardians are strongly encouraged to provide direct supervision, ensure their child’s safety, and assess their child’s capability with regard to different play elements. There is inherent risk to climbing on rocks, logs, ladders, and all other play elements in the park. Please use discretion. Use each play element as intended. If you have questions about a particular element, please see a park team member.

Bonnet Springs Park is an all-ages, family friendly facility. Have respect for others and the park. Offensive language including loud/excessive profanity, inappropriate clothing, destruction of property and plants, intoxication, use of drugs, or other disrespectful behaviors will not be tolerated. No merchandise sales, solicitation, surveying, or distribution of handbills or flyers is allowed without written consent from the park. Management reserves the right to remove and permanently revoke use rights of individuals that are not behaving in the spirit of Bonnet Springs Park.



Rules and Camp BSP Expectations

Arriving and Departing

Below is an overview of what to expect. More details will be sent to registered campers prior to January 16th.

- Check-in time: 5:00 PM – 6:00pm
- Check-out time/clean up: 10:00 AM
- Campers must park their cars in the designated parking location with a parking pass.
- Each reserved campsite must include a minimum of one adult and one child, who is at least five years of age. Each campsite group can have a maximum of six people. All campers will need to be listed in your registration.
- BSP gate closes at 6:00PM; reentry will not be permitted until the park reopens at 6:00AM

Rules

Breaking the rules is grounds for dismissal without refund.

- Any person under 18 years of age will only be allowed to camp with a responsible adult and must be supervised at all times.
- Quiet hours are 11:00 PM – 6:00 AM. Campers must respect these hours.
- Campers must abide by “Leave No Trace” guidelines.
- Pets other than service animals are not permitted.
- Prepackaged food that does not require cooking is permitted.
- All coolers are subject to search at any time.
- No smoking is permitted (traditional or e-cigarettes) except in designated areas.
- All plants, animals, and park property are protected. Collection, destruction, or disturbance is prohibited.
- If advised weather creates an unsafe environment, campers are advised to take shelter in the closest public building with four walls and a roof (Event Center).

Equipment and Supplies

- A camping tent is required for family campsite occupancy. All camping equipment must be contained within the boundary of the site.
- Flashlights and headlamps are permitted.
- See the enclosed Packing List for more information.

Prohibited Items and Conduct

Being in possession of these items, or engaging in the conduct listed, is grounds for dismissal without refund.

- Alcohol and drugs, including medical marijuana
- Feeding wildlife
- Fires, cooking materials, stoves, and grills. BSP will manage a community campfire in a designated location and food will be provided
- Weapons or fireworks
- Amplified music. Please use headphones for your music
- Glass containers
- Generators
- Electric heaters or AC units
- Drones or RC equipment
- Motorized vehicles other than mobility ECV's
- Fishing outside of designated hours (see camping schedule)
- Hammocks
- Motorized toys or toys with small parts

7:00AM - Wakeup call

7:00AM – 8:00AM – Light breakfast & coffee

8:00-9:30AM – Early-bird fishing + bird watching

9:30-10:30AM – Clean-up camp site

10:30AM – Checkout & departure



Recommended Packing List

- Sleeping palate (i.e. sleeping bag, pillow, blanket, etc.) for each camper
- Tent no larger than 12'x12' and ground tarp
- Flashlights or headlamps
- Clothing for an overnight stay (socks, hat, jackets, pants, etc.)
- Toiletries (i.e. toothbrush, toothpaste; showers not available)
- Refillable water bottle
- Bug spray
- Medications in proper containers
- Weather appropriate gear (i.e. swimsuit, rain jacket, towel, hat etc.)
- Portable phone chargers
- *Recommended:* wagon for transporting camping materials
- *Optional:* hand sanitizer (bathrooms available)
- *Optional:* folding chairs
- *Optional:* pre-packaged food and cooler
- *Optional:* basic first aid kit (BSP will have kits available)

Provided By Bonnet Springs Park

- Free activities and a campfire
- Overnight security
- Dinner, s'mores, and light breakfast
- Restrooms listed in order of closest proximity to the campsites: Outdoor Kitchen and Ruthven Family Playground.
The Outdoor Kitchen restrooms will remain open overnight.
- First Aid Kits

Please note: Electricity access will NOT be provided.
